9:30 AM	<p><u>Training Report –including Functional Exercise update</u> Presented by Mark Rudolph - Mark Rudolph has served 35 years with the Medford MA Police Department currently serving as a lieutenant in the Field Services Division. He has served multiple roles in the department including patrol, motor unit, patrol supervisor, special operations unit commander, professional standards unit commander, and shift commander. Prior to entering police service he worked in healthcare and industrial security. He currently serves as the training subcommittee chairman for the Mystic Region Emergency Planning Committee (MREPC). In 2014 he assembled a planning team to develop and facilitate the MREPC E9:thanol Tabletop Exercise. Lt. Rudolph has both a Master of Arts Degree and a Baccalaureate Degree in Criminal Justice Administration.</p>
10:00 AM	<p><u>CFATS Chemical Facilities Anti-Terrorism Standards</u> The CFATS Program Under the CFATS program, the Department of Homeland Security works with facilities that are assessed to be at high risk of terrorist attack or exploitation due to their holdings of certain chemicals. These high-risk facilities meet requirements to develop and implement security plans designed to address risk-based performance standards and reduce the threat of terrorism. CFATS is the first DHS regulatory program focused specifically on security at high-risk chemical facilities. DHS determines a facility's initial risk profile by requiring facilities in possession of any Chemical of Interest (COI) in an amount at or above specific threshold quantities or concentrations to complete a risk assessment, known as a Top-Screen questionnaire. If DHS determines that a facility is high-risk, the facility must submit for approval a Site Security Plan or an Alternative Security Program that includes security measures to meet applicable risk-based performance standards established by DHS. 	<p>accidents at these facilities—historically about 150 each year—result in fatalities and serious injuries, evacuations, and risk of harm to health and the environment.</p> <p><u>Goal</u> Under this initiative, EPA will focus on reducing the risks of accidents through innovative accident prevention measures, and improving response capabilities.</p>
